In 1999, Scott turned the golf course over to his three sons but before he could enjoy retirement, he was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Shortly thereafter the disease took Scott from this world.

When Scott passed away, there were 37 homes in Champions Village, so he saw the infancy of his second dream. If it weren't for Scott Krause, there wouldn't be a Champions Village.
