Professional Golfer, Winner of the 1948 Masters tournament. Club Professional Claude Harmon stunned the golfing world by winning the 12th Masters in record-tying fashion. His three rounds of 70, combined with a third-round 69 gave him the a five-stroke victory over Cary Middlecoff. After the victory, Harmon returned to Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck, New York, to resume his summer duties as a head pro.



There are few families in the game of golf that have had the impact that the Harmon family name has. Four sons -- Bill, Butch, Craig and Dick -- grew up under the watchful eye of their father who was considered golf's most legendary teaching professional, Claude Harmon.

That legendary tutor, Claude, is often remembered for his victory in the 1948 Masters -- impressively his one and only PGA Tour victory. But to know Claude Harmon the teacher was to best understand his contributions to the game.

Today, Claude Harmon's legacy continues.
